SESSION ABSTRACT

Energy storage is a key component of many resilience solutions. This tutorial breaks down the basics of energy storage system (ESS) safety into three categories: 1) how ESS fail; 2) how to prevent ESS from failing; and 3) how to respond to ESS failures. The first topic cluster begins with basic safety concerns for various battery energy storage systems, including both Li-ion and aqueous technologies. Then the tutorial proceeds with an overview of system-level safety concerns beyond the battery, including electrical safety and issues with balance of plant components. The second topic cluster, on preventing ESS failure, includes an overview of current and upcoming codes and standards for ESS as well as the perspective of Authorities Having Jurisdiction (AHJs) on best practices for installations. This section concludes with guidance on establishing long-term sustainable maintenance practices for ESS. The third track offers best practices for emergency preparedness and response from the perspective of both building operators/managers and firefighters. This tutorial incorporates insights from R&D at national labs, policy influencers, and first responders.
