



Presentation and Publication Policy

The Resilience Week Leadership is delighted that your paper has been accepted for presentation. This note is designed to explain the different methods for presentations.

Presentations

Authors attending one of the Resilience Week symposia will present their work in either an oral or a poster session format.

Oral presentations

Before the event: Authors will upload a prerecording of their presentation following the online guidance on the Resilience Week website. Each author will have a total of 10 minutes to present their contribution. A basic rule of thumb is 2 minutes/slide. Presentations should use the presentation template available on the symposium webpage.

During the Event: Authors will have 5 minutes to answer live questions and answers from the session chair that is collected from the attendees through the virtual solution. Authors must arrive before their designated session time to participate in the questions and answers portion.

Works in progress, Industry and Lightning presentations

Similar to above, but a lesser time is normally allotted for works in progress and for lightning presentations, as defined by the session chair(s).

Poster Session presentations

Posters will be featured at a designated time and a special virtual solution. Displays should be designed to capture attention, and also be readable from several feet away. Large font sizes and generous use of color are highly recommended. The material displayed should convey the essence of the work, and not necessarily the details.

Internet/Proceedings Publication

An electronic copy of the paper proceedings will be provided to all symposium participants via a download location. After the symposium, any plenary/keynote videos will also be posted on the associated Resilience Week symposium website.
