Traditional Wedding Vow #1

I (Name) take you (Name) to be my (wife/husband); to have and to hold from this day forward, for better or for worse, for richer or for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and cherish from this day forward, until death do us part.

Traditional Wedding Vow #2

(Name) will you have (Name) as your wife/husband? Will you love her/him, comfort her/him, honor and keep her/him, forsaking all others and keeping only unto her/him for as long as you both shall live?

Repeat after me: (Name) I take you to be my wife/husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better or for worse, for richer or for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish forever. These things I promise for life.

Traditional Wedding Vow #3

I (Name) take you (Name) to be my beloved (wife/husband), to have and to hold, to honor and treasure you, to be at your side in sorrow and in joy, in good times and in bad, and to love and cherish you always. I promise you this from my heart, for all the days of my life.

Traditional Wedding Vow #4

I (Name) take you (Name) to be my (husband/wife), my constant friend, my faithful partner, and my love from this day forward. In the presence of God, our family and our friends, I offer you my solemn vow, to be your faithful partner in sickness and in health, in good times and in bad, in joy and sorrow. I promise to love you unconditionally, to support you in your goals, to honor and respect you, to laugh with you and cry with you, and to cherish you for as long as we both shall live.

Traditional Wedding Vow #5

(Name) I promise that from this day forward, you will not walk alone. My heart is your shelter, and my arms are your home. May God bless you always, and may we walk together though all things. May you feel deeply loved, because you are. Today I give you my heart. I have no greater gift to give. I promise to give you my best. I'm so honored to call you my husband/wife. I'm so blessed to call you mine. I thank God for bringing you into my life.

Traditional Civil Ceremony Vow

(Name) I take you to be my (husband/wife). I take you with all your faults and strengths, as I offer myself to you, with my faults and strengths. I will help you when you need help, and I will turn to you when I need help. I choose you as the person with whom I will spend my life.

(Name) I vow to love and care for you, for as long as we both shall live.
