2 Thessalonians 1 Teaching Points and Bible Study Questions

Perseverance in Faith

In the face of trials and tribulations, the Thessalonians were commended for their steadfast faith. This is a powerful reminder that our faith is not just for the good times but is meant to be a rock during life's storms. As Paul writes, "We ought always to thank God for you, brothers, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more" (2 Thessalonians 1:3).
