





*If something I am asked to do for another feels burdensome; if, yielding to an inward unwillingness, I avoid doing it, then I know nothing of Calvary love.*



<p>... even as I have loved you...(John 13:34)</p>	<p>A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another. (John 13:34-35)</p>
<p>For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many. (Mark 10:45)</p> <p>Then He poured water into the basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded. (John 13:5)</p>	<p>For you were called to freedom, brethren; only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. (Gal. 5:13)</p>
<p>Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing. (Luke 23:34)</p> <p>Even as God, for Christ's sake, has forgiven you (Eph. 4:32)</p>	<p>Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you. (Eph. 4:32)</p> <p>Above all, keep fervent in your love for one another, because love covers a multitude of sins. (I Peter 4:8)</p>
<p>I am the Good Shepherd; the good Shepherd lays down His life for His Sheep (John 10:11)</p>	<p>Greater love has no one than this: that someone lay down his life for His friends (John 15:13)</p>
<p>But emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men.</p>	<p>Make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose. Do nothing from selfishness</p>

<p>Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. (Phi 2:7-8)</p>	<p>or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others. <i>Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus...</i>(Phil. 2:2-5)</p> <p>So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. Beyond all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity. (Col. 3:12-14)</p>
