



East Gate

For 2,000 years East Gate has been the main entrance into the historic walled city of Chester.

Looking at East Gate today, in all its Georgian delicacy, it is difficult to imagine this as the main gateway to Deva – one of the most important Roman fortresses in Britain. It is far easier to picture elegant Georgian ladies and gentlemen enjoying a promenade around the Walls than marching Roman legions.


Although East Gate has changed dramatically over time, Eastgate Street has retained its role in the heart of Chester and is still the city's busiest thoroughfare.

Standing here 1,400 years ago you would have seen Roman legions, like these, patrolling the East Gate. The Romans built the original fortress walls both for defence and to symbolise their dominance over local tribes.

In July 1403, after the 'Hotspur' rebellion had been defeated, King Henry IV chose Chester's East Gate to display the remains of Henry Hotspur Percy, as a warning to other potential traitors. The severed heads of Sir Richard Venables and Sir Richard Vernon were also displayed on pikes above the battlements.

In the 19th century Eastgate Street was a bustling thoroughfare, as this print shows. The famous East Gate Clock was added in 1899 to commemorate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897.

Mr. Thompson, who was the first organist, died in 1922.
A memorial plaque was placed in the organ loft in his honor.
The organ was built by Mr. J. C. Thompson, who was a

the late Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Thompson, who were
members of the congregation.
The organ was dedicated in 1922.
