

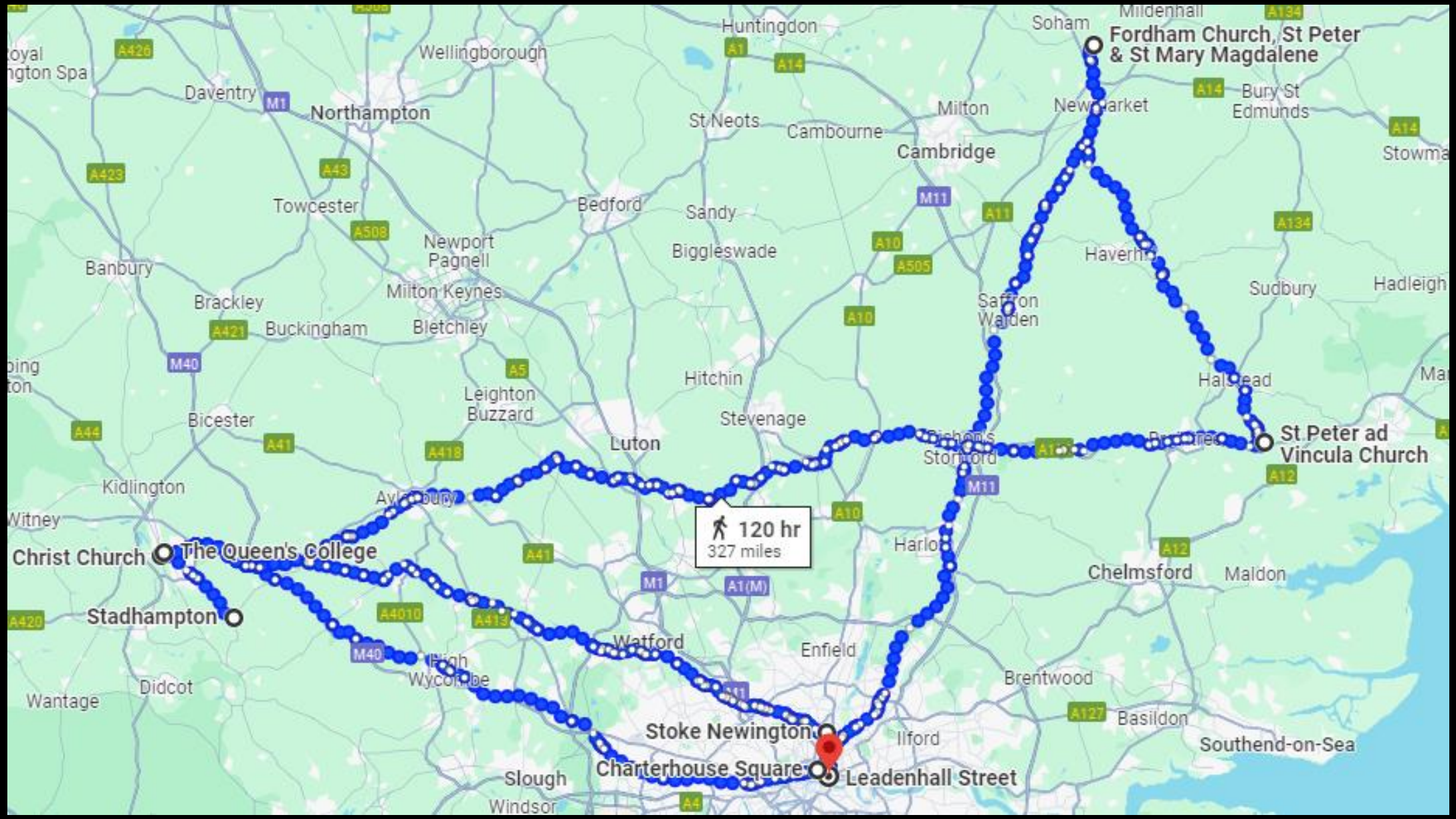

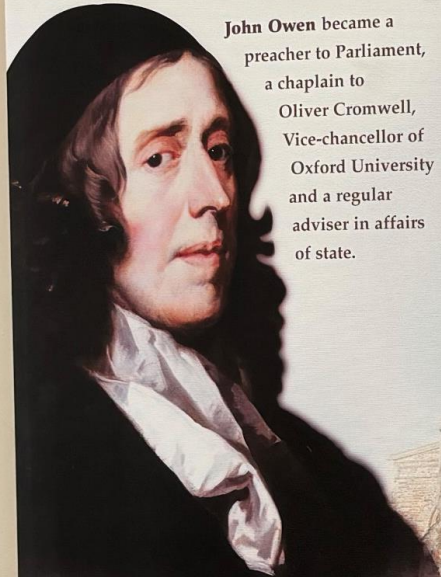






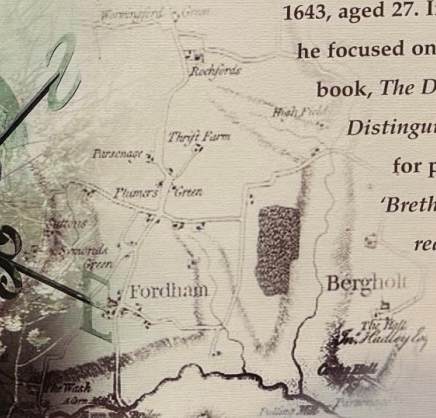
John Owen 1616-1683

Pastor of Fordham Church from 1643-1646



John Owen became a preacher to Parliament, a chaplain to Oliver Cromwell, Vice-chancellor of Oxford University and a regular adviser in affairs of state.

Owen's first theological work, a spirited defence of Calvinism, gained him his first parish of Fordham in north Essex in 1643, aged 27. In his three years as pastor he focused on parish work, writing one book, *The Duty of Pastors and People Distinguished*, and two catechisms for parishioners which begin: 'Brethren, my heart's desire and request unto God for you is, that you may be saved.'

His greatest and most lasting achievements were as a theologian, producing arguably the finest body of theological scholarship in the English speaking world. His...

The day before he died Owen wrote, "I am leaving the ship of the church in a storm; but whilst the great Pilot is in it, the loss of a poor under-rower will be inconsiderable." His tomb can be seen at Bunhill Fields burial ground in the City of London.

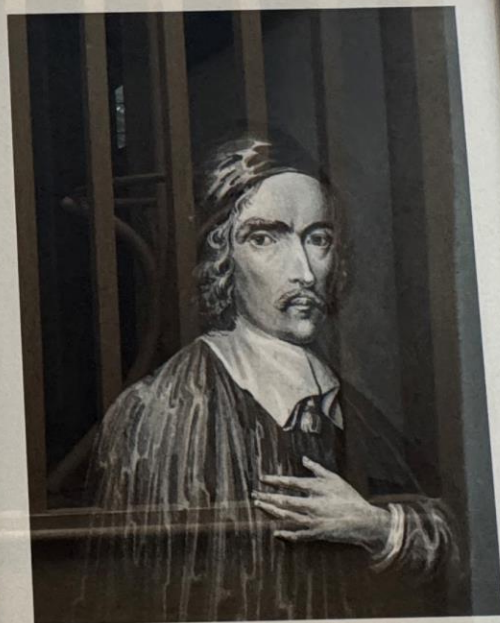

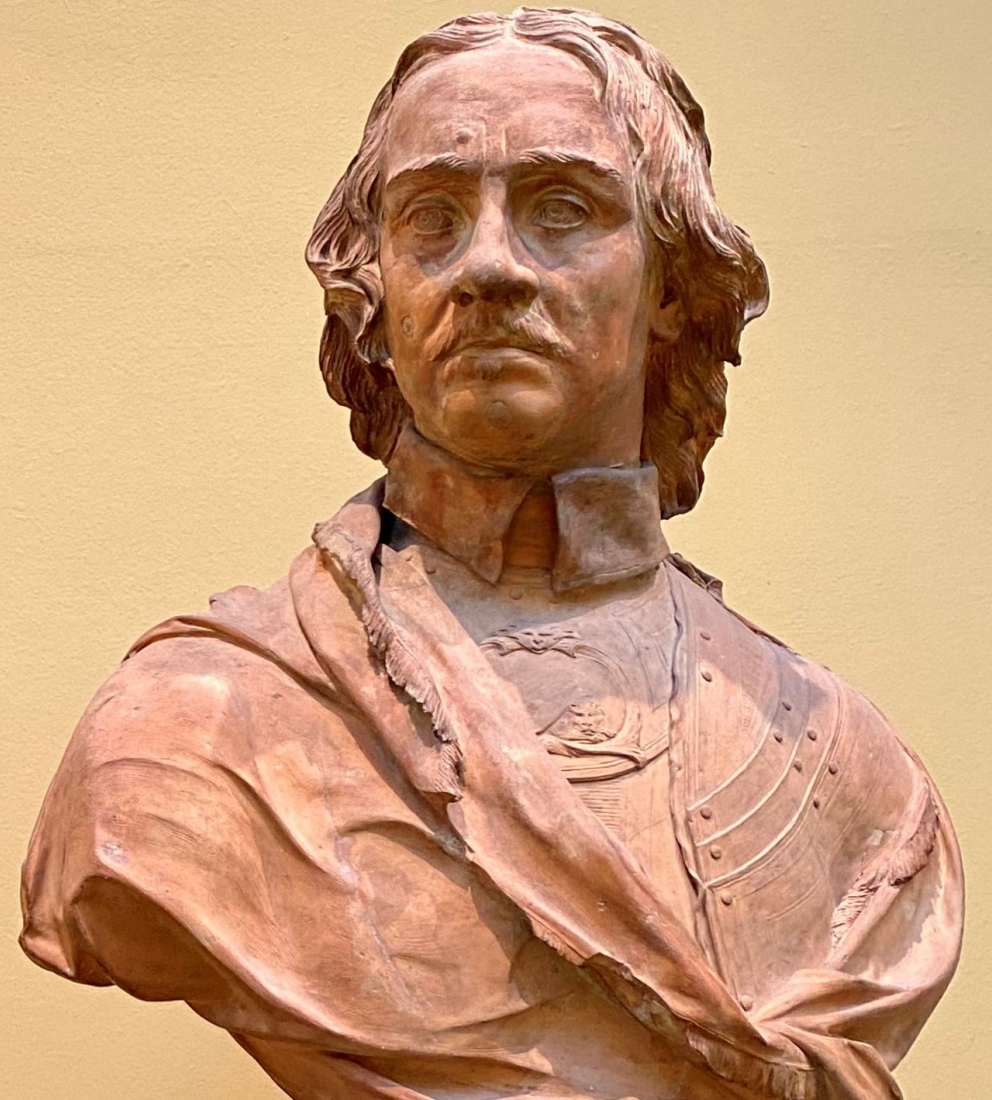

“I am glad to hear that that performance [*The Glory of Christ*] is put to the press; but, O brother Payne, the long looked-for day is come at last, in which I shall see that glory in another manner than I have ever done yet, or was capable of doing in this world!”

Owen developed the theme of Christ's supremacy throughout his writings, including *Meditations and discourses on the glory of Christ*. In its preface Owen declared, 'The revelation made of Christ in the blessed Gospel is far more excellent, more glorious, and more filled with rays of divine wisdom and goodness, than the whole creation and the just comprehension of it, if attainable, can contain or afford. Without the knowledge hereof, the mind of man, however priding itself in other inventions and discoveries, is wrapped up in darkness and confusion'.
