
The INFALLIBLE LAW of LOVE

--Infallible in that it does not err (Matthew 22:37-40).




--Infallible in that it does not err (Matthew 22:37-40).

When it comes to the true Christian's relationship to the world experientially we will not err if we gauge a "thing" by the law of love.






