

## Discussion Questions • Habakkuk 2:2-20 NIV

- 1. Read vs.2-3.
  - a. What was Habakkuk to do with the revelation he received from God?
  - b. What does God say about the revelation He's about to give to Habakkuk?
  - c. What do we learn about God from these 2 verses?
- 2. Read vs.4-5.
  - a. How does God describe the Babylonians in these 2 verses?
  - b. What is God's instruction to the righteous person living under the tyranny of injustice and violence? (See vs.4)
  - c. Discuss the meaning of, <sup>4</sup> "...but the righteous person will live by his faithfulness." How would this verse apply to us today?
    (A Christian trusts God in the darkest of times and holds on to the conviction that God's promises will be fulfilled)
- 3. Vs.6-19 is a record of 5 taunts (woes) against Babylon.
  - a. What is a "woe?" Name and briefly discuss other "woes" mentioned in other passages of scripture. (*Isaiah 10:1-4, 30:1-2, 33:1; Nahum 3:1-7; Matthew 1:20-22; Matthew 23:13-37; Mark 14:21*)
  - b. Each taunt in these verses (*Habakkuk 2:6-19*) has the following 3 elements; a woe, a reason for the woe, and an announcement of doom. Identify these 3 elements in each of the 5 taunts mentioned by God in these verses (vs.6-9; vs.9-11; vs.12-14; vs.15-17 and vs.18-19).
  - c. What warnings can we heed from these woes?
- 4. God concludes his response to Habakkuk's questions with the following statement found in verse 20... "The Lord is in his holy temple; let all the earth be silent before him."
  - a. How are we to understand this verse in light of everything God says in the preceding verses?
  - b. How would this verse bring comfort to those facing challenging circumstances?

**OPTIONAL**: What is one thing you are willing to change in your life as a result of what you have learned from the discussion?
