## Looking Up

[All Together]

Jonah is an Old Testament book that tells the thrilling tale of God's disobedient messenger from the Northern Kingdom of Israel. We don't know with certainty when or by whom the book was written, but the story is probably set around 700BC, when Nineveh was the capital of the regional superpower Assyria. Over the next four weeks, we'll be exploring what these events teach us about God's love for all nations.

Using the colour coded readings in your Readings booklet, act out Jonah 1:1-17 (or at least read it dramatically!) You'll need volunteers to be the narrator, God, the captain, the sailors and Jonah. You might also want to designate parts of your space as Joppa (in Israel), Tarshish, and Nineveh (see map in Readings booklet).

1. What do we learn about God's character in this story?

2. What do Jonah, the sailors, and us come to learn about Yahweh in this chapter?

3. What do the characters in the story teach us about right responses to God?

4. Why would God bother sending a message to Nineveh?

#### Read Mark 4:35-41

5. Mark obviously wants us to remember Jonah when we read this event about Jesus. What similarities and differences are there between these two messengers, and why do you think Mark has drawn the connection?

6. Jonah's sin put people around him in danger. When *we* disobey God's word, how do *we* endanger people around *us*?

 Jonah looks like a complete turkey, but we're all guilty of ignoring God's word and doing the exact opposite. Where are you doing a Jonah at the moment and need to repent? (Refer to Ephesians 4 if you need help) 8. When the disciples saw Jesus' authority and power, they were filled with holy fear. How will you cultivate this healthy fear in your life?

# Looking Up

Last week we met Jonah, God's messenger who went AWOL (Absent WithOut Leave). We saw how gospel-writer Mark contrasted Jonah against God's ultimate messenger, Jesus. We reflected on God's nature and the foolishness of our sin. Yet we also saw God provide a merciful rescue.

#### Read Jonah 2

1. Have a quick google on your phone and find some pictures of Jonah inside the fish. What do you think it would have really been like in there?

- 2. What does Jonah recognise:
  - a) about his situation

b) about God

c) about himself

3. Jonah was so hardened, it took a couple of days basting in the digestive juices of a fish to bring him to humbly cry out to God. What circumstances has God used in your life to bring you to remember God and cry out to him?

Read Matthew 12:38-41

4. What is Jesus saying about himself and the people of his generation?

Jonah's 'kind-of-resurrection' pointed to Jesus' actual resurrection. Jesus' actual resurrection means that all who trust him will have an actual resurrection as well. After death, God will bring the lives of all who trust in Jesus up from the pit.

Nineveh's response was a miracle. But so is every person who responds to Jesus with faith and repentance! The same God who sent Jonah and brought Nineveh to their knees is sending you and me, and we have an even greater message than Jonah's!
