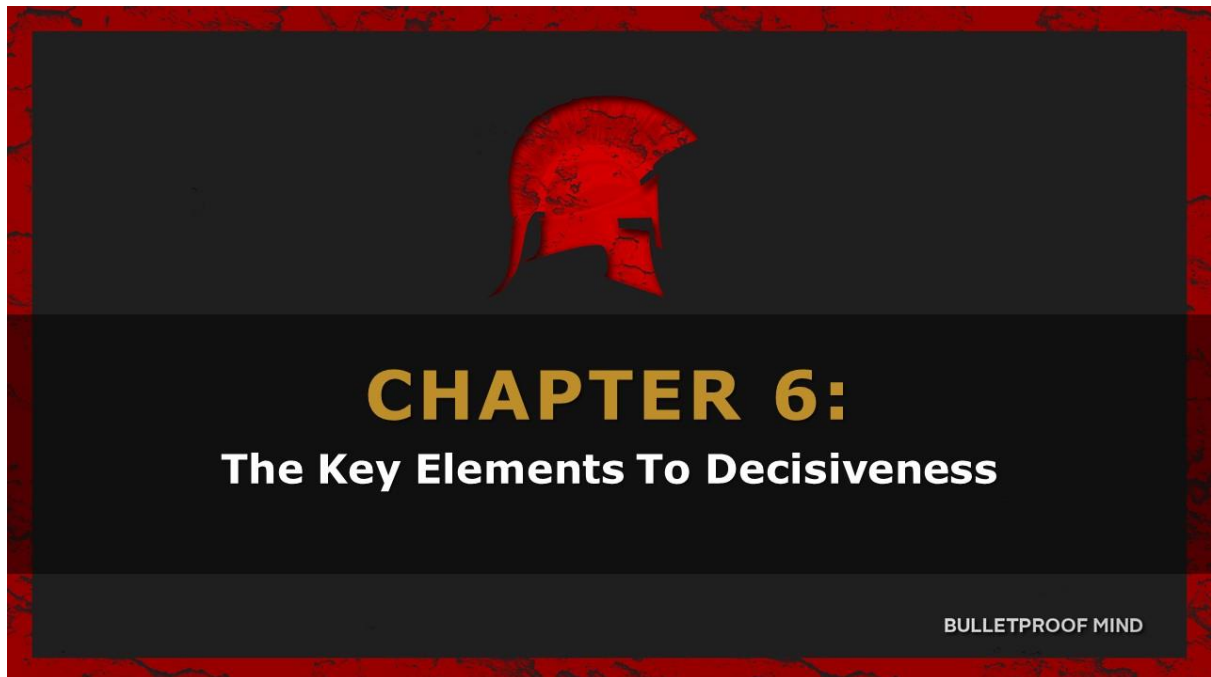


6-0 The Key Elements To Decisiveness



S1: Hi there. In this part, we will discuss the key elements of decisiveness - which is very much a trait of one with a Bulletproof Mind.



S2: Decisive people attract success. This is the law of attraction at work. No one became successful because they sat around, thinking the world was going to fall apart around them.



S3: One key element of decisiveness is confidence. By exuding confidence in whatever that you do, you will find yourself more likely to succeed. Even if you fail, you'll learn from your mistakes and imagine yourself succeeding the next time you try.



S4: Taking risks is also another key element of decisiveness. However, you can't just recklessly go into anything. Potential risks must be weighted and calculated beforehand.



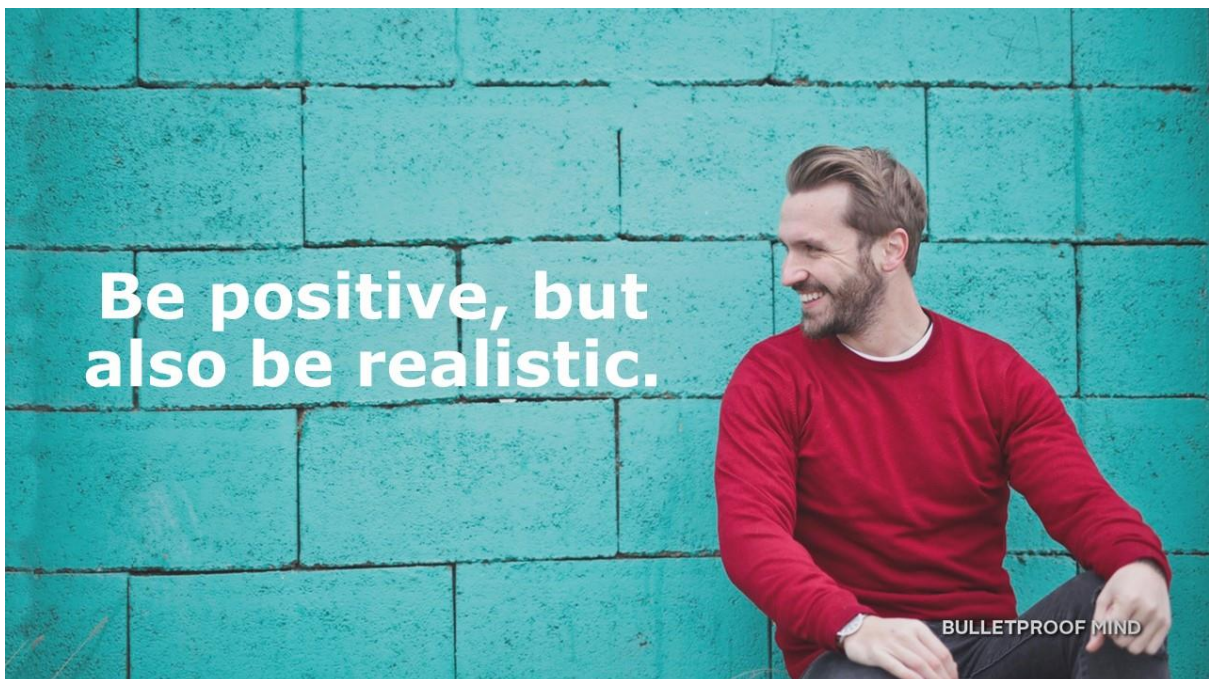
S5: An example would be when asking for a raise. Before you act, think about the best time to do it. If profits are down and the boss is in a sour mood, don't ask. Save the asking for when your boss is in a better mood, and not overwhelmed.



S6: Have a brighter outlook on the past, and then focus on the now. Also, don't focus too much on the future. Over thinking outcomes can cause you to back away from taking a risk.



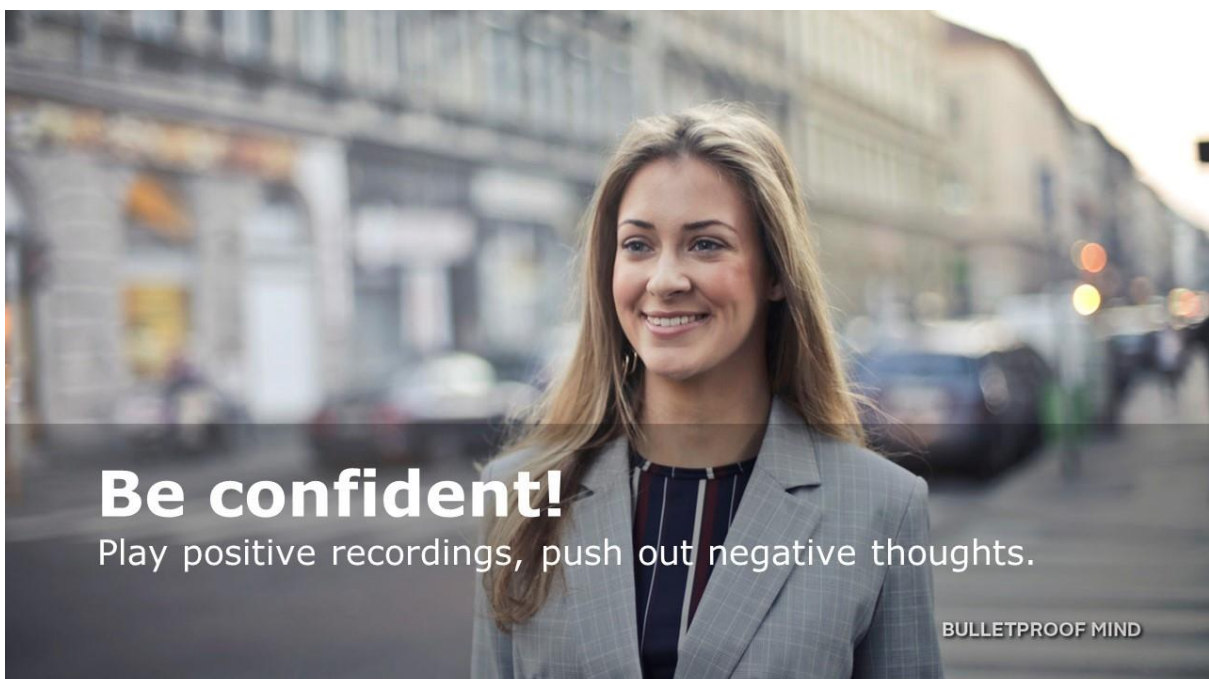
S7: Step out of your comfort zone. You might think that working that boring job every day is fine because you're familiar with it and it gives you financial peace of mind. However, if you are unhappy and stuck doing the same thing for the rest of your life, you'll live your life with nothing but regrets.



S8: Also, be positive, but also be realistic. Being optimistic is great, but positive thinking will not make you invincible. Consider possible consequences.



S9: Now, let's look into applying the key elements of decisiveness in our lives.



S10: Be confident! You can play positive recordings, push out negative thoughts, and be like the engine that keeps repeating that "You can do it!" It's hard to change your outlook right away, but by slowly incorporating more positive elements into your life, you can slowly get rid of doubts.



S11: Take calculated risks. Perhaps you're wanting to ask someone out. Think about the right time to do it. Don't wait, but don't do it right away. Strike up a conversation and then figure out the best time to ask. Set yourself on a timeframe if you have to in order to give you time to build up some courage, but not procrastinate.



S12: Don't listen to people who say it can't be done. Question them back: "Why can't it be done?"



S13: Step out of the “comfort zone”. If it doesn’t work, return back to it, and at least know that you have tried. Think and plan about the alternatives.
